Dear Jane, I have been watching the changes in North Galiano since the early sixties, and am

surprised and dismayed at how the story has developed. Our Forest Lots were, I thought, the very last part of the Island that would be turned into commercial enterprises with accommodation and meals provided for financial gain. It won't take us long, at this rate, before there is no natural landscape which is left alone. From the recent pamphlet concerning the Red Cedar trees, it would appear that we are almost at the point of no return.

Having read the letter from Art Moses to the Local Trust Committee, dated March 31, it appears that an applicant can ask for substantial changes in zoning without providing the Trust with many of the requirements for such zoning, and with "unanticipated requests" for more consideration.

Please consider the long-term results of any loosening of any local by-law provisions on an island the size of Galiano - with an apparent increase in local real estate interest and a "rush to get out of the city" on the horizon, we should be exercising the restrictions on development that we already have, and even considering making them more stringent.
