






regarding the above-noted referral. As has been communicated to Islands Trust, any request		
provided by any government agency or proponent for Lyackson to review information associated		
with referrals that have the potential to further infringe on our Rights and Title must be		
accompanied by provision of adequate capacity funding to allow for us to conduct a thorough		
review and adequately respond. As you have not provided Lyackson First Nation with adequate		
resource capacity to enable meaningful consultation, your duty to consult cannot be fulfilled.		
Lyackson First Nation recognizes this referral as being in the Hul'qumi'num Treaty Group's		
Statement of Intent area. Lyackson First Nation has/had key harvesting, hunting and culturally		
significant sites within this area. Lyackson First Nation has inhabited the Cowichan and		
Chemainus valleys, Gulf Islands, and the lower Fraser River since time immemorial. Our		
intention is to continue to take up and take back the roles, responsibilities and authorities over		
our territories and waters. We recognize that the land, the sea, and the people are		
interdependent and holistically interconnected. Structures and boundaries imposed by colonial		
institutions ignore our connectedness and have never worked for us. It is our responsibility to		
ensure the wellbeing of our relatives according to our teachings. You should further be aware		
that meaningful consultation requires dialogue and shared decisionmaking. According to our		
snuw'uyulh, we are expected to exercise care in our use of the natural world and to act in 'uy'		
shqwalawun with all things. We have our own protocols that respect our traditional ways of		
being that we bring to this work. We do not support the proposal to amend the land use		
designation as the proposal does not clearly set out how the zoning will respect our traditional		
ways of being or support our traditional cultural practices.




