**Subject:** No Need To Panic (Yet)

Good Morning Everyone,

Before we go into complete panic mode regarding the previously scheduled Trust business meeting on the 16th, I have received a courteous and detailed email reply from Trust Planner, Margo Thomaidis to my question concerning recent discussions between the Trust and Rogers.

She explains that last January, the LTC "directed staff to work with Rogers to prepare a report including an analysis on consultation that Rogers has completed to date and comparison with the [Hornby Strategy for Antenna Systems](#)."

Staff met with the proponent and Brian Gregg in late April to discuss the consultation process to date. "Rogers agreed to prepare a summary of the public consultation process thus far.

"Staff recently received Rogers' summary and anticipate it to be shared for information at the next LTC regular business meeting." (June 16)

This is why the cell tower is on the agenda.

We will be given time to look at this latest information before a subsequent vote is taken.

To be sure, Alex is being contacted right now to confirm that there will be no cell tower vote on the 16th. (If there *is* to be a vote, I will update this notification.)

Further to Oakley Rankin's comment about the cell tower fire depicted on our flier and webpage — and identified by me as "spontaneous combustion": I've phone Oakley to thank him for his correction. He was right, I was wrong in my assumption. It remains troubling that the chances of a Rogers repairperson accidentally starting a fire atop a tower could spread to adjacent trees.

I've posted this on the Grapevine webpage.

I have also contacted West Coast Environmental Law today, asking for a date on our funding decision.
