#### PURPOSE

The purpose of this memo is to provide the North Pender Island Local Trust Committee (LTC) an update on the Land Use Bylaw (LUB) Review Project.

#### Consultation:

To date the LTC has completed two Community Information Meetings (CIM) regarding the LUB Review Project. An electronic CIM was held on September 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020 to discuss the topic of Maximum Floor Area with a total of seven attendees. The second CIM was held on October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 with the topic of Industrial Regulations review with a total of ten attendees. The third CIM is scheduled for October 24<sup>th</sup> (Agriculture topic) and fourth CIM for November 7<sup>th</sup> (for other topics: Conservation Subdivision Review, Tourist Commercial Regulation Review, Shoreline Regulations Review, and Minor Technical Amendment).

As shown in the attached Project Charter, the project is in the stage of early public consultation and referrals. The information gathered from the CIMs and correspondence will help determine how the LTC may wish to proceed with amendments to the LUB for each topic. The project timeline states that draft bylaws should be presented by mid-Spring and further consultation for the draft bylaws will commence next summer (June to August 2021).

#### Joint LTC Meeting:

The North Pender and South Pender Trustees have expressed an interest in holding a joint LTC meeting in order to discuss project topics; specifically maximum floor area regulations. There has been interest from the LTCs to have a consistent approach with siting regulations in the North Pender and South Pender Land Use Bylaws. If the North Pender LTC wishes to schedule such a meeting, staff suggest the LTC consider holding an electronic Special Meeting via Zoom in conjunction with the South Pender LTC in December 2020 or January 2021.

#### NEXT STEPS

Continue with public consultation and early referrals. Staff will report back with a summary of comments in early 2021 and with next steps for the project.

## Purpose: project to consider implementation of a OCP policies through amendments to the Land Use Bylaw

**Background:** The current OCP was adopted in 2007. Subsequently a number of amendments have been made to both the OCP and LUB that implemented some policies in the OCP, however there has not been a comprehensive review of the Land Use Bylaw to implement all relevant policies and initiatives in the OCP, nor to update the LUB for technical and minor amendments.
