



responsibility, in collaboration with Ministry of Municipal Affairs, to engage with and build relationships. Each of these diverse First Nations may have different approaches to engagement, may be at different stages of the treaty process, or may have historic treaties or modern treaties in place. First Nations may also have varying levels of capacity to work with local governments or the province and may only seek to engage on certain concerns and not others. As well, many First Nations have reserves within the Islands Trust area, which are either occupied or unoccupied. These reserve areas fall under federal jurisdiction.

The Islands Trust as part of its reconciliation commitment moved forward with a Reconciliation Declaration<sup>6</sup>, a Reconciliation Action Plan 2019-2022<sup>7</sup>, and began the process of enacting the TRC Calls to Action #57<sup>8</sup>. The Islands Trust authored several discussion papers<sup>9</sup> and reports<sup>10</sup> acknowledging past wrongs and the commitment the Islands Trust was undertaking to move forward in a good way toward mutually respectful relationships build on reconciliation principles. Through this process it was clearly stated to the Islands Trust that past land use decisions had greatly impacted First Nations; had resulted in the desecration of ancestral resting places; had destroyed village sites, and cultural areas; and contributed to a lack of trust between First Nations and the Islands Trust.

The Islands Trust also began, during this time, to understand and hear about the historical connections that Indigenous people living on islands had with First Nations and their kinship ties to those Nations. Many of the Indigenous people living on the islands have connections to the First Nations governments within the Islands Trust area but those connections have been lost due to the Indian Act, enfranchisement<sup>11</sup>, and marriage to non-Indigenous settlers who moved to the islands from the 1800s to present<sup>12</sup>.

Although the Islands Trust has no statutory obligation to engage on a government to government level with individual Indigenous people it is important to ensure that we are reflecting the spirit of reconciliation in the work that we undertake and listening and understanding all constituents both Indigenous and non-Indigenous who call the islands home.
