We have been permanent Mayne Island residents for the last 13 years. We are concerned about the proposed Islands Trust document prohibiting the building of any new private docks.

Mayne Island has only two public docks. Miners Bay in Active pass is extremely busy with BC Ferries traffic and is also subject to strong currents. The other dock, Horton Bay, is slated to be removed after the Anson Road dock is finished. Anson Road has been in the works for over 10 years but has only been completed up to the parking lots stage. The building of the actual dock has been postponed numerous times due to funding problems.

Living on an island, we need docks!

The information about the proposed banning of new private docks suggests that residents have been informed and advised about the proposal by information meetings. We are unaware of such public meetings that have been held on Mayne Island. For the past year and a half there have no public meetings held on Mayne Island since March 2020 due to Covid 19 restrictions.
