When the referral request were sent to the Local Trust Committees, several of them, including Saltspring LTC, Mayne LTC, Gabriola LTC, South Pender Island LTC, Saturna LTC, and Thetis LTC declined to comment until meaningful public engagement was completed. It's clear that there will be meaningful public engagement through ISL Engineering, starting in February and ending in April 2022. I hope when in April the ISL draft report is available, the Islands 2050 policy document will be submitted back to the Local Trust Committees to allow discussion at the community level - something that ISL's Public Engagement Plan doesn't seem to include.
