Regarding

*"In order to effectively preserve and protect the unique amenities and environment of the Trust Area in this context, it will be critical to identify, monitor, mitigate, and adapt to the ripple effects of climate change on both ecosystems and communities. In this context, Trust Council will benefit from being guided by the best available science, social science, local knowledge, and Indigenous ways of knowing. In the face of uncertainties around the rate and scale of climate impacts, it will also be important to foster more precautionary and adaptive..."*

and:

*must be established to transition to more compact, energy efficient, and appropriately situated development that is carefully planned....*

and finally: **neither hazardous (wood smoke is extremely carcinogenic and "hazardous" ) nor industrial waste should be disposed of in the Trust Area;**

**PLEASE** add the serious health issue of air pollution from the plethora of wood burning appliances. We literally are choked out every "wood burning season" ...The recent climate report already acknowledges that wood burning is a serious climate emergency and health issue.

**WHEN** and how soon will this be addressed, please, as it was not clear that you are considering getting people on board with cleaner alternatives to wood burning. Sooner rather than later.

Grantville Street is The Dark Ages when it comes to air pollution from wood burners.
