Thank you Dan
I have reviewed these maps and they do not have the level of geomorphological or geotechnical data that I was seeking in my question to Planner Dubyna. As was discussed on the call this evening, Keats is a focus of this specific planning initiative and as a professional geoscientist, would want to ensure that you and the trustees have all relevant scientific data to make an informed decision on the proposed bylaws. A reference was made as to the level of funding that has informed work to date. Additional scientific study might map the geomorphology/geology of the foreshore in more detail and could assist in your deliberations as trustees on this bylaw which has

certainly raised anxiety amongst many of our fellow island neighbors. Such data could assist with potential variances that staff may receive. The bylaw has limited impact personally but if we are applying provincial regulations to a unique situation at Keats then we should ensure that any decisions are informed by a comprehensive data analysis. We need to curate the bylaws to the unique character of Keats. I did not get comfort from the materials online or the discussion this evening that all Keats-specific relevant foreshore data has been collected and collated for the benefit of an informed decision for these Keats specific bylaws.

I will prepare a more reasoned commentary for the public hearing on Oct 14.

I understand that this email will inform the records of public input on this matter and thank you and staff for all the work you do.
