*To the Islands Trust Hornby Island LTC:*

It has been important to us, and to our local agents, that we always respect and work within Islands Trust guidelines and regulations. We educate and encourage our guests to conserve water and to "tread lightly" in the Hornby community.

Our family loves Hornby, we love the property, and we love to opportunity to share its wonders with visitors to the island. We also appreciate that this is our opportunity to support the island economy in many ways, and at many levels, from management, to maintenance, gardeners, cleaners, and other services; and to the artists, artisans, restaurants, grocery stores, and many other businesses all around the island.

Without the opportunity to do vacation rentals at our property, we would not be able to maintain it, or to pay the annual taxes and insurance. Indeed, we would reluctantly need to sell it. Due to the nature and value of the property, it would become neither affordable nor long-term housing for island residents.

We appreciate the need to balance the housing, social, environmental, economic and other aspects of the Hornby Island community. It is our view that, managed wisely, short-term vacation rentals can and should remain a vibrant part of the Hornby Island "ecosystem" for many years to come.
