Dear Trustees and Island Trust staff,

I know the issue is a difficult one to resolve, as a proportion of the human population here have strong affection for the sheep. The lambs, especially are very lovable, and I believe the sheep are sentient beings. It would be ideal, to me, if some sheep farmer could be found off-island who would accept them, but I realize that may well be a far-out fantasy. If that wasn't feasible, I would be in favour of a program to cull the sheep. Decreasing the numbers. It would have to happen periodically, as their numbers would increase again. I suppose a sterilization program would be too difficult and expensive. (Sad too to have sheep around but no lambs.) But something to consider if it was feasible.
